STOLPERSTEINE On-site Memorial Concert Cello solo 'El Cant dels Ocells' by Pau Casals	18:30 - 19:00	The Stolpersteine, or "stumbling stones," are a constellation of around 75,000 small memorials placed on the sidewalks of European cities to remember the victims of the Holocaust and honor their memory. In Spain there are only around 480. We stop in front of one such stone in the heart of Madrid where these small commemorative plaques embedded in sidewalks pay tribute to the Spaniards deported to the German Concentration Camps of World War II. 

ICMEMOHRI and ICETHICS Joint EXPERT MEETING Museums in Ukraine Facing War, Civil Unrest, and Conflict

Amsterdam 1-3 November 2023

Theme

The war in Ukraine poses huge challenges and dilemmas for museum professionals. They have to function in threatening conditions in a war where cultural heritage is under deliberate attack. What are the implications of this situation for their work, their personal lives and for the protection of their collections? How do they plan for the post-war period – both in terms of narrative and of collecting tangible and intangible heritage during the war? In this expert meeting, ICMEMOHRI and IC Ethics offer Ukrainian museum professionals the possibility to exchange experiences, ideas, dilemmas and good practices with colleagues from countries that also faced armed conflict: Bangladesh, Rwanda, Argentina, Lebanon, Bosnia-Herzegovina, the Netherlands and the United States. Based on the needs of the Ukrainian participants, this expert meeting will offer a platform for discussing a broad range of questions like: How will historical and military events and the role of the aggressor be represented? How can museums be future places of remembrance and reconciliation? How do they work with and support contemporary artists? How can trauma be processed through culture and, in particular, through museum presentation? How to address ethical dilemmas such as cultural forensics and collecting?
